About Pediatric Health

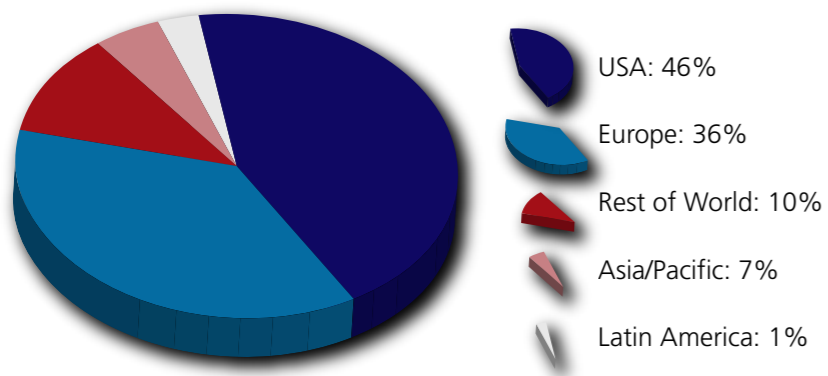
